I am a self-trained photographer, urban planner, and bow tie & fedora enthusiast in Toronto, Canada. With a background in urban design, I look for patterns, lines, and forms that give structure to urban environments.

I have exhibited, solo and in group exhibitions, in Toronto at the Art Gallery of Ontario Rental + Sales Gallery, Toronto Image Works, galleryDK, gallerywest, art101, Pearson International Airport, Hangman Gallery, Twist Gallery, Akasha Art Projects, and others. I have also exhibited at the Department of Canadian Heritage, and in several office galleries.



In the fall of 2008 I switched to medium and large format film cameras exclusively. In addition to greatly loving the feel and deliberative process of shooting film, the resulting negatives allow for high resolution scans that greatly exceed the capacity of current digital technologies. I do all of my own post processing, with the exception of high-resolution drum scans (when utilized). At present, my prints are typically traditional, silver-based chromagenic prints.

In 2009, I visited Camp X-Ray, a temporary prison facility at US Naval Station Guantanamo Bay. While X-Ray was a notorious early outpost in the War on Terror, time has erased all signs of its past inhabitants. Since 2002 it has been left abandoned and is being reclaimed by nature. My photographs from that project show its current state of decay, and are published as a book titled **CAMP X-RAY | GUANTANAMO BAY**, available from Blurb.com.

I am a founding member of the DK Photo Group, and a former co-owner of galleryDK. In 2009, the DKPG was the subject of a 6-episode television series called PhotoXplorers. My photos are included in several corporate and private collections in North America and are available through the Art Gallery of Ontario Rental and Sales Gallery, and Eye Buy Art.
